





This Month in... 1955





In December 1955, British engineer Christopher Cockerell patented his design of the hovercraft. A prototype was unveiled to the public in 1959, and the craft successfully crossed the channel the same year. These photographs show a fashion shoot for M&S in 1968, onboard the 'Princess Margaret', a hovercraft docked at the Dover Hoverport.

RMS Queen Elizabeth, an ocean liner operated by the Cunard Line, was retired from service in December 1967. The ship had provided weekly services between Southampton and New York since its maiden voyage in 1946. These photographs show a family onboard the ship for a fashion photoshoot in 1961




More photographs from the M&S photoshoot onboard HMS Queen Elizabeth in 1961, six years before the ship was retired in December 1967.

Christmas Pomander - Try making this sweet smelling Christmas decoration to hang on the Christmas tree.



You will need: An orange, cloves, cocktail stick, ribbon, four or five pins, optional ground cinnamon and sandwich bag

 Push the cloves through the skin of the orange. You could try making a pattern, or simply scatter them around the orange. If you find pushing the cloves in difficult, try making a hole with a cocktail stick first.



- Tie your ribbon around the orange and pin in place at the top and bottom of the orange
- If using spices, place a teaspoon of cinnamon and/or ginger in a plastic sandwich bag. Place the orange in the bag and shake around.



Remove from the bag and hang up to enjoy the festive smell!
