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

## Sheet music, c1915

Sheet music was a best-seller at M&S in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, at a time when a family sing-song around the piano was a popular form of entertainment. As well as Christmas carols, customers could buy music for folk songs, hymns and national anthems. This booklet includes 'Hark! The Herald Angels Sing' and 'Good King Wenceslas'.

This was the front cover for a customer magazine in 1932, the image shows a family making their way through the snow with a parcel wrapped in string and a bunch of holly.

# Christmas decoration advert, 1909

This advert was printed in an issue of the 'Grand Annual', an M&S magazine for customers featuring stories, letters, features and adverts. Customers could buy a box of Christmas decorations for five shillings, which M&S would then post out.

On receipt of P.O. value 5/- we shall be pleased to forward this parcel to any address in the United Kingdom, post free. MARKS & SPENCER, LTD., Derby Street, Cheetham, MANCHESTER.

20/- parcel contains four times the quantity.

## Airmail Christmas card, 1944

During the Second World War, the M&S Personnel Department kept in touch with all members of staff, wherever they were stationed around the world. Many of the men and women serving overseas sent Christmas cards back to Head Office. This card from Lt Myers is marked with the initials of the South East Asia Command.

# Victory Christmas Dinner menu, 1945

This menu was printed for a special dinner for staff at Blackpool M&S. The war had been over for two months, so Christmas 1945 must have felt very different to previous years. Although there were still many restrictions on food, colleagues didn't have to use their ration books for meals at work, so this dinner would have been a real treat!

## Christmas advert, 1958

This advert shows a couple in a very modern kitchen for the time. The advert promotes M&S clothing as well as Christmas puddings and mince pies. Aprons were a bestseller in the 1950s, M&S even produced matching child-size aprons! The Christmas pudding would have cost 2s 6d, the mince pies were 1s 2d for four, and the cotton apron was 5s.






# Christmas hairstyle, 1964

This photograph appeared in the staff magazine 'Sparks', which included stories, photographs, jokes, recipes and puzzles. In the 1950s and 1960s hairdressers visited branches of M&S so anyone who worked in the store could have a haircut. The store hairdresser at M&S in Coventry created this festive masterpiece including a wreath of mistletoe and lots of hairspray!

- Do you think the model would have worn this hairstyle to go shopping?




# Christmas food, 1970

This display includes festive favourites like Brussels sprouts, Christmas cake, mince pies, sausage rolls and cheese. The range of food sold at M&S grew in the 1970s. In 1971 we trialled frozen foods, from carrots to cod steaks and in 1973 we launched convenience foods including boil-in-the-bag ravioli and frozen Indian meals.

- Can you think of any Christmas foods not included in this picture?







# Christmas party clothes, 1977

This advert shows a couple standing on the stairs at a Christmas party, as Father Christmas creeps up the stairs behind them! She wears a brightly coloured kaftan dress and he wears a velvet jacket and smart bowtie. The dress would have cost £8.99, the velvet jacket would have cost £32.50.

# Party clothes - then and now

The photo on the left shows party outfits sold at M&S in 1979. The man's velvet jacket cost £39.95 and was also available in navy, brown and black. The image on the right shows a similar velvet tuxedo jacket, worn with a bow tie and shirt with black buttons. This outfit was launched for Christmas 2024, and the jacket cost £99.

The top photo shows a party outfit from 1981 – the model wears a velvet skirt with a tartan waistband costing £35, and a white ruffled blouse. The photo on the right shows party clothes available at M&S in 2024, including a white blouse covered in sequins and black velvet bows, which cost £45.

- Can you think of any other crafts using the prints?









# Have a Co... Make a pomander

Try making this sweet smelling Christmas decoration to hang on the Christmas tree.

### You will need:

- an orange per person
- cloves
- cocktail stick
- ribbon
- four or five pins each
- optional ground cinnamon and sandwich bag
- Push the cloves through the skin of the orange. You could make a pattern, or simply scatter them around the orange. If you find pushing the cloves in difficult, make a hole with a cocktail stick first.
- Tie your ribbon around the orange and pin in place at the top and bottom of the orange.



- If using cinnamon, place a teaspoon of the spice in a plastic sandwich bag. Place the orange in the bag and shake.
- Remove from the bag and hang up to enjoy the festive scent!
